GREENE KING ABBOT ALE OUTSELLS ALL OTHER BEERS AT CAMRA'S LONDON PUB

Handpumped Abbot Ale is 'easily' the bestselling beer at CAMRA's first London pub, the Nag's Head in Hampstead, reports CAMRA Invest-

ments' administrative executive, Chris Hutt.



It is a glowing tribute to Greene King's popular, extra-strong brew, which is widely available in Cambridge. The pub opened two months ago:

Chris, of 27 Chedworth Street, Cambridge, explained: 'It's No. 1 of the four beers there, Abbot, Fuller's London Pride, Sam Smith's Old Brewery bitter and Brakspear's ordinary bitter.

'It's in the double-figures of barrels every week, and there are two deliveries a week from Rayment's.'
(Greene King own and still use the Rayment's brew-

ery at Furneux Palham in Hertfordshire).

Chris put Abbot's success down to two reasons, the beer's strength, and the pub's location.

'As far as I know, we are the only pub in London that serves it. There's one tied house, the Builder's Arms, at New Barnet,' he added.

Tolly Cobbold, the Ipswich brewers, support CAMRA's ideals - and welcome members' support for their beers.

Bitter, Cantab and 'old' flowed freely, direct from the cask, as brewery officials and representatives mingled with members, exchanging ideas.

But Mr Cobbold said the brewer had to decide which pubs were 'horses for courses' for installing traditional serving methods.
