CAMBRIDGE MAGISTRATES DEFER RULING ON EXTRA HALF-HOUR'S DRINKING TIME

Cambridge beer drinkers will know on Friday March 5 whether or not pubs can stay open every evening until 11 p.m.

Magistrates decided at the city Brewster Sessions on Friday February 6 to advertise an application by Cambridge and District Licensed Victuallers' Association so that possible objections could be considered.

Cambridge (County), Bottisham and Melbourn magistrates had already deferred similar applications, and Linton and Caxton magistrates were expected to do the same.

Cambridge CAMRA members welcome the LVA's request for a variation in drinking hours - so that pubs could open at 10.30 a.m. instead of 10 a.m., and serve drinks between Monday - Thursday until 11 p.m., instead of 10.30 p.m.

Curiously, CAMRA supported an extra half-hour's evening drinking time in Nottingham, where the local LVA opposed it and magistrates refused the application.
