SECOND EDITION OF 'REAL ALE IN CAMBRIDGESHIRE' TO BE PUBLISHED IN JUNE

The second annual edition of 'Real Ale in Cambridgeshire' will be published on Tuesday June 1.

This was decided by representatives of the Cambridge, Peterborough and St Neots branches at a meeting at Huntingdon last month.

Cambridge campaign manager, Allan Challis (right) is anxious to hear of amendments or additions to last year's guide.

Secretary Bill Noblett, who will edit the guide, said he hoped it would be published in time for the Riverside Festival at St Neots on Saturday June 5.

He predicted a bigger, more comprehensive guide this year, to include full facilities of every 'real ale' pub, including food, car-parking, and pub games.

The format will also be more conveniently 'pocket' size.

Members met at Huntingdon's only 'real ale' pub, the delightful Victoria Inn (Paine's EG and bitter).

Those present included Cambridge committee member, Steve Davies-King, St Neots chairman, George Cotton, John Curry, and Peterborough treasurer, Brendan Bowle.
